My Story Questions

These questions/activities help the group know one another and transition to deeper discussion. Choose one.

- OR.... You might start the meeting with one person sharing highlights of their story. Set up a rotation.
- 1) If you had to choose any city in the world to live in, besides Knoxville, where would you go? Why?
- 2) If you could go back and choose a different career, would you? What would you choose?

Study Questions

Try to go in order from observation to interpretation to application. Feel free to choose a few questions you like from each section or add your own.

Observation Questions: What do you observe about the text? READ PSALM 110

- 1) What words or phrases stand out to you? Why?
- 2) Where do you see language that shows the subject is both a king and a priest?
- 3) How do the references in Acts 2:34-36 and Hebrews 6:20 show that Jesus is the subject of Psalm 110?

<u>Interpretation Questions: What does it mean?</u> (Let scripture interpret scripture)

- 4) Psalm 110:1-2 talks about Jesus being seated at the right hand of God until His enemies are made a footstool. How does this image of victory give encouragement in personal battles or challenges?
- 5) Discuss the challenges and blessings of submitting to Jesus' lordship in daily life. How does a community of faith help us in this journey?
- 6) How does the assurance of Jesus' ultimate victory (Psalm 110:5-7) influence the way you face personal, spiritual, or relational struggles?
- 7) Reflect on Jesus' role as our High Priest. What is the role of a priest? How does this deepen your understanding of prayer and your approach to God in times of need? (Hebrews 4:14-16)
- 8) Psalm 110:3 speaks of people volunteering "freely in the day of His power". What does it mean to freely offer yourself to Jesus? Can you share an example of when you've done this?

Application Questions: What do I do?

- 9) In what practical ways can we, as a community, embody the victory and authority of Jesus in our church, homes, and workplaces?
- 10) What is a step you can take this week to more fully recognize and live under the kingship of Jesus?
- 11) How can prayer look different this week as you consider Jesus interceding for you? (Romans 8:26-27)

Responding to Jesus

Offer these questions for personal reflection before your group prayer time. Practice listening for God's voice.

- 1) Lord, "How can the reality of resurrection inspire my daily life?"
- 2) Lord, "What conversations do you want to have with me?
